A Message from the Board of Trustees

As many Plain Township residents are aware, there is an incorporation issue on the ballot for the primary election on May 4, 2010, on which only effected precincts will be permitted to vote. This issue will present to voters the issue of incorporating Plain Township into the "City of Plain".

Following the election on the issue of incorporation, if the proposition for incorporation fails, the incorporation proceedings will come to an immediate halt and no further petitions for incorporation may be filed for at least three years after the date of the election. If the election results in incorporation, the costs of the election would be charged to the "City of Plain".

If the incorporation issue passes and is held to be valid, there would then need to be an election of officers. A special election would then be held to determine the new officers for the municipal corporation.

A city must select elected and appointed officials as follows: a mayor, city council (with a minimum of seven members, perhaps more), chief financial officer, community development or planning director, law director, director of public services, director of public safety, and a civil service commission.

Any public service contract previously entered into by Plain Township prior to incorporation must be renegotiated within six months after the effective date of incorporation. Any real property within the new municipal corporation owned by an existing municipality is exempt from zoning regulations of the new municipality as long as it is used for public purposes by the municipal owner.

The newly formed city must function as a statutory municipality for at least one year. If after that year the city would like to adopt a charter form of government, it will have the ability to modify the statutory municipality; however, that issue must be submitted to the municipality's electorate.

The Stark County Probate Court will be called upon to decide how best to distribute assets between the newly formed city and the remaining township. It is highly likely that the township that is left over would be subsumed and incorporated into the neighboring municipalities, either the new city, the City of Canton, or the City of North Canton. The new municipality must also decide whether or not to institute a municipal income tax, and how the provision of services is going to continue.

The Plain Township Board of Trustees recognizes that incorporation is a significant change from the current existence and operation of Plain Township. Ohio's Child Passenger Safety Laws

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for children under the age of fourteen. A booster seat is designed to help a child sit higher on the vehicle seat so that the lap-shoulder belt fits correctly. Without the booster, a seatbelt can ride up on a child's belly or above the child's head, which could easily cause severe injuries in an accident. Recent updates to these laws can make a simple drive to school confusing, so here is the breakdown:

- ◆ **Every child** under the age of 4 years and less than 40 pounds must ride in a harnessed-in child car seat.
- ◆ **Every child** under the age of 8 years must ride in a booster seat or other appropriate child safety seat until the child is 4'9" or taller.
- ◆ **Every child** age 8 to 15 years who is not secured in a car seat must be secured in the vehicle's seatbelt.
- ◆ **Protect your children as they ride!** The backseat is the safest place for children under 13 years old.

Plain Township EMS Receives STEMI Award

On Thursday, February 18, 2010, Mercy Medical Center presented an award to three members of the Plain Township Fire and Rescue Department. The STEMI (S.T. Elevation Myocardial Infarction) Award was presented to Bill Meers, Craig Hamilton, and David Schwitzgabel. This award

was in response to an EMS chest pain call they responded to in November 2009. Their quick response and recognition played a significant role in the Door to Balloon Angioplasty time of 9 minutes and 45 seconds. This time is the fastest Door to Balloon time ever reported. This was



a collaborative effort between EMS, Emergency Department and the Cardiac Catheterization Lab.

We would like to thank the residents of Plain Township for their continued support and the Township Board of Trustees for the purchase of the heart monitoring equipment. This technology will enable the Plain Township Fire Department to provide the best

pre-hospital care that is available. This cutting edge technology allows our paramedics to perform a 12 lead ECG, which assists in diagnosing a life threatening or potential life threatening myocardial infarction. Paramedics then have the capability to transmit that ECG through a web-based system to the ER and to the Cardiac Catheterization Lab before the patient is even transported to the hospital.

Once again, we would like to congratulate Bill, Craig, and David for a job well done.

Remember, time matters when a heart attack occurs, you have only a short amount of time before the heart muscle is damaged. Reducing the time it takes to receive treatment will improve your chances of survival and recovery.

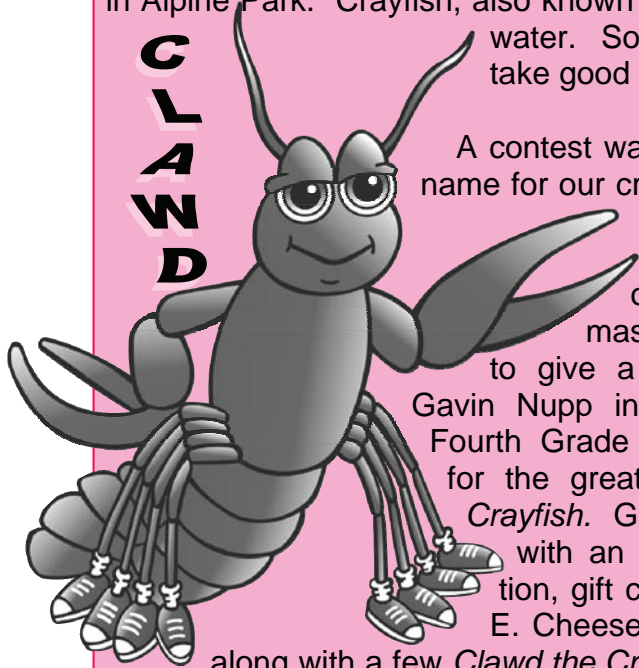
2010 Census—Count Us In!

With the sounds of spring knocking at our door, the Plain Township Zoning Department would like to pass along a few reminders to all township property owners—residential or commercial.

House Rentals

During the past few years, house rentals have become more popular. At this time, Plain Township does not require you to register the rental of your home. We do, however, have rules and regulations as to what type of dwelling your home may become. Depending upon your Zoning District, your house may either be rented as a single family home, a two-family home (duplex), or a three-family home (triplex). (*Licensed Family Homes do not fall into this category.*) Please be sure to contact the Plain Township Zoning Department to find out what Zoning District Classification your home is. Changing your home from a single family home to a two-family home is a Zoning violation; you must have all of the proper paperwork and permits in place before the change.



Zoning Certificate of Conformance

This is to all commercial property owners and potential tenants—a Certificate of Conformance Permit is required *prior* to anyone occupying a building in a Business, Office, or Industrial District. A new permit is required for any change in ownership, tenant, or business use. You can pick up an application at the Zoning Department.

Zoning Permits Required

Before you begin *any* construction project, your first step should be to contact the Zoning Department to discuss the minimum setbacks and maximum size requirements that apply to your property. In addition to a permit application, a site plan drawn to scale of your property is required to illustrate the new construction's size and location on the property. **PERMITS MUST BE ISSUED BEFORE THE WORK BEGINS!**

If you are hiring a contractor, the Zoning Department recommends that you discuss with your contractor who will be responsible for obtaining permits. Remember that ultimately, the property owner is responsible for compliance of his or her property with all Township zoning requirements.

Complaint Procedure

With the warmer season upon us, the Plain Township Zoning Department has been receiving numerous nuisance complaints; for the most part, due to high grass and/or weeds. The Zoning Department has the following policy regarding the filing and investigation of complaints for zoning violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health and/or safety: (ORC Section 505.87)

- ⊗ Complaints will be taken in person, in writing, or by telephone.
- ⊗ Complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner.
- ⊗ A response will be forwarded to identifiable complainants regarding the conditions found and intended course of action following initial investigation of the complaint.
- ⊗ Anonymous complaints will be taken, but are not prioritized, and will only be investigated when all regularly scheduled work has been completed and there is additional time in the department.
- ⊗ Complaints regarding high grass and/or weeds must meet the following stipulations:
 - ⊗ Grass and/or weeds must be over eight inches tall.
 - ⊗ Grass that is eight inches or taller must cover 50% of the land or more.

Sign Permits

Almost any temporary sign requires a sign permit, so before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your sign permit. A Temporary Sign Permit is good for thirty days. You may put out a temporary sign for two months out of a six month time period. Please apply for and obtain your Temporary Sign Permit *before* placing it outside of your business. **All permanent signs require permits!** Please check with the Zoning Department for all size regulations.



You Can Prevent Drainage Problems

Please remember not to blow or rake leaves, grass clippings or any other debris into the storm sewers, ditches or streets as this not only is in violation of ORC 3767.17 but also is the source of drainage problems and flooding during heavy rain falls. Please also remember that it is illegal to dump oil, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides or other hazardous products into ditches, culverts or catch basins. All violators will be prosecuted. If you see dumping taking place, please report it to the Stark County Health Department by calling (330) 493-9904.

Items in the Right-of-Way

Portable hoops and permanent hoops are very popular throughout the Township. Please remember that no basketball hoops or trash cans may be placed in the road right-of-way. The Trustees are asking that these hoops be moved out of the right-of-way.

Please trim back your trees, bushes, hedges, etc. that may cause a sight obstruction for drivers. The courts have determined that these may be a joint liability between the owner and the governmental agency for the hazards in the right-of-way. The Township is not responsible for trees in the right-of-way.

Spring Maintenance

The Road Crew will be sweeping all Township streets beginning the second week of March if the weather is permitting. Yard repairs from snowplow damage will begin in early April. Asphalt curb repair will be done during the summer months. *If you see a pothole on a Township road, please call the Road Department at (330) 492-3423. Potholes will be repaired as soon as we are aware of them.*

Permits Required

Road Opening Permits are required for any excavation in the Township right-of-way. A permit can be obtained by coming to the Road Garage at 6300 Heminger Avenue NE. The fee is \$50.00.

Driveway Permits are required for new construction or any improvements you make to your existing driveway. This permit gives you the guidelines for paving and apron requirements. A permit can be obtained by coming to the Road Garage. The fee is \$10.00

2009 Year End Report

During 2009, the Road crew completed 3,650 work order requests for services such as patching, street sweeping, catch basin repairs, curb repairs, drainage, vactoring, roadside mowing, snowplowing, and deicing of township roads.

The Road Department also completed the following work:

- ⊗ Paved 11.57 miles of roads
- ⊗ Repaired and power boxed township roads using 399 tons of asphalt
- ⊗ Repaired/replaced 2,512 feet of concrete curb and gutter
- ⊗ Installed/repared 4,209 feet of asphalt curb
- ⊗ Striped 24.30 miles of center line and 40.93 miles of edge line
- ⊗ Crack sealed a total of 4.63 miles of roadway
- ⊗ Vactored 74,567 feet of ditch line
- ⊗ Flushed/cleaned 14,741 feet of pipe
- ⊗ Cleaned 165 catch basins
- ⊗ Installed, replaced or repaired 3,875 feet of culvert pipe
- ⊗ Reconstructed 440 feet of roadside ditches
- ⊗ Swept 680 curb miles of road
