


But it's only a few drops...

In high traffic areas, drops add up quick.

- Your car contains fluids that allow it to function properly. When fluids leak, larger problems may occur. Fixing a small leak now may prevent expansive car repair bills in the future.
- Fluids in your car can be extremely toxic. Fix leaks so children and pets aren't exposed to toxic puddles or ingest toxic fluids.
- When it rains car fluids wash into local rivers and streams that drain to the waterways. Communities may use local surface water as their source of drinking water.
- Local and migrating wildlife rely on a healthy water systems for survival.

Car Wash Woes:

Did you ever wonder where the soapy water goes when you wash your car in the driveway or parking lot?

- Water drains off impervious (hard) surfaces into the road, then into the storm drain.
- Most storm drains go directly to streams without any treatment.
- Car washing facilities are required to dispose of their used, polluted water responsibly.
- If you must wash at home, washing your car in the lawn allows water to be absorbed and filtered before it goes to your local stream.
